

TREE PRUNING

KEEPING YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD SAFE






Sometimes trees need to be pruned for safety if they get too close to power lines or electrical equipment.


This is like giving the tree a haircut.

If tree branches fall in a storm and knock down power lines, they can be very dangerous. Can you help the bucket truck get to the tree that needs pruning?



When we plant, we want to pick a tree that will fit with the plants and electrical equipment around it as it grows. If the tree won't get in the way, we say it's compatible with the surrounding area.


We love planting new trees, and when we plant compatible trees near power lines, they may never need to be pruned at all!




Power lines and electrical equipment can be very dangerous, so never play near them, especially with kites, balloons, or drones.




Never climb trees

in one.














When we trim trees we need a lot of special equipment.
